Question 1: Yes / I'm not a big one for hand outs, however I do believe in one that helps themselves and helping the homeless families first. As I have stated in my website <u>www.alfoster.com</u>. I think that developers should have to build a certain percentage of homes that are affordable housing. We don't have to build huge wooden apartment buildings or communities full of duplexes or fourplexes that would eventually turn into low rental slum areas. What I'm saying is not all homes have to be over two thousand square feet with oak floors with marble counter tops. Now I don't have all the details so I'm not affraid to say I don't have all the answers, we could look at providing housing alternatives or various agencies. One problem I do see having is to stop the people with money from running into these communities and buying up these affordable housing and becoming landlords.

I would have to look at creating alternative ways to protect low income and fixed income seniors citizens in this city ensuring the diversity of their communities. It never did make sence to me why my parents living in the S.E. were taxed to pay for the Twin Arenas in the N.W. or the Wave Pool in the N.E. when they didn't have any children or grandchildren using the facilities.

The newer houses in these areas were worth a lot more than their home, closer to the facilities, and their children use the facilities but everyone shares the construction cost and the cost of the upkeep using it or not.

QUESTION 4: Yes / As a leader the environment concerns me very much. City council could spend more time as a team working on programs that reduce the amount of poisons we use and cut back the wastes that pollute our water tables. E.U.B. not only excepted, but ordered the court reporter to delete the evidence given in that part of the transcripts. Pollution is a big problem but you have to remember it's our government and the way they deal with large companies that tend to make all the rules.
